PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Washington State is currently facing an epidemic of addiction and deaths related to the use of prescription opioids. This course aims to help physicians and their clinical teams improve their care of patients with chronic pain and addiction. Recent legislation, Washington State HB 2876 requires physicians to have four hours of education on long acting opioids. This course will satisfy the requirement.

The Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000 permits physicians who are trained or experienced in opioid addiction treatment to obtain waivers to treat opioid dependence in their office. Both buprenorphine and the combination of buprenorphine with naloxone are approved by the FDA for use in detoxification and maintenance treatment of opioid dependence. This course and successful completion of the exam, satisfy the training requirement to receive a waiver to prescribe buprenorphine.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This program is intended for physicians who wish to apply for the DEA waiver to treat opioid dependence in their office. Mid-level providers, ARNPs, and other non-physician professionals are not eligible for the waiver, but they are strongly encouraged to attend. Attendance is limited to 50.

PROGRAM GOALS

After attending this session participants will be able to:

- Describe the prerequisites to prescribe buprenorphine in an office-based practice
- Discuss clinically relevant pharmacological characteristics of buprenorphine
- Identify appropriate patients for office-based treatment of opioid addiction
- Describe induction and maintenance protocols, e.g. the use of COWS scale
- Discuss two options for acute pain management in opioid dependent patients.
- Describe patients who would be eligible and appropriate for a Project ECHO consultation.

COMPLETING THE REQUEST FOR A DEA WAIVER

Physicians who complete this course will be eligible to apply for a DEA waiver. With participant's permission, AOAAM/AAAP will report the names of participants directly to the Secretary of HHS within 4 weeks of the program thus eliminating the need to send the paperwork. During the course participants will have an opportunity to fill out the waiver request. Persons requesting a waiver will need to bring their DEA number and medical license number.
