### COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of this program participants will be able to:

- Review the definition of opioid use disorder
- Review the evidence for naltrexone, methadone, and buprenorphine for treating opioid use disorder
- Review buprenorphine pharmacology and practicalities
- Discuss barriers that PCPs cite to becoming waived to prescribe buprenorphine for opioid use disorder
- By the end of the session, participants will be able to describe one potential side effect and lab monitoring guidelines for antipsychotics
- To provide basic guidelines for providing appropriate health care to the transgender and gender non-conforming community as well as providing local resources to assist in such care
- Appreciate the importance of recognizing and treating obesity
- Understand the risks and benefits of bariatric surgery
- Measles and hepatitis C remain major global public health problems with substantial morbidity and mortality
- To prepare providers in the screening, diagnosis, and strategies for prevention of these infections
- Address evaluation and preferred therapies for initial treatment of hepatitis C, as well as monitoring after treatment of infection
- Review the epidemiology and pathology of osteoarthritis
- Understand the most up to date evidence-based treatment and management strategies for large joint (i.e. knee, hip, shoulder) osteoarthritis (OA)
- Discuss and identify epidemiological characteristics of PBC
- Identify history, physical exam findings in patients that characterize PBC
- Proceed with workup of an isolated elevation of alkaline phosphatase
- Identify treatment course and the benefits of treatment for PBC
- Define when you should consider prophylactic medications for migraine
- Provide a brief review of the evidence behind different pharmacologic options for migraine prophylaxis
- Provide an algorithm to approach initiation of therapy
